School Rules

1) You MUST NOT LEAVE THE SCHOOL SITE without:

a) Written parental permission

b) Approval by Mr Aldous, Mr Hayton or your Head of Year

c) Signing out at the office as you leave and signing in when you return.

2) The **PUPIL PLANNER** must be in school each day and must be with you for all lessons. It is an important means of communication between school and pupils/parents.

3) **SCHOOL UNIFORM** must be worn **correctly**. In case of difficulty a pass must be obtained from the appropriate Year Head and carried for inspection by any teacher.

4) **PE KIT** must be brought for all appropriate lessons. All **JEWELLERY MUST BE REMOVED** during PE lessons.

5) NO CHEWING OF GUM & NO SMOKING is permitted on the school site.

6) Do not bring **valuable items** (e.g. Mobile phones, "I Pods", Computer Games) to school.

7) The wearing of **facial studs or rings** is not permitted for health and safety reasons. One small stud or sleeper type earring only may be worn in each ear.

8) SCHOOL BAGS must be such that A4 books and folders and all personal equipment (pens, pencils, ruler, calculator, etc) can be carried in them. Small handbags and large kit bags should not be carried around the school.
