Hartismere PE department were delighted to present their annual sports awards evening on Tuesday 18 July 2023. The sports awards evening recognises students and their sporting achievements in the 2022-2023 academic year. Over 375 students represented the school in at least one sport across the school year and we were thrilled to have nearly 300 of these pupils present at the ceremony. The PE department had great pleasure in presenting over 90 awards including teachers' player and players' player awards in a host of sports ranging from netball to swimming. Awards were also up for grabs for captains of the year, most improved sports performers, sports leader of the year, team of year and sporting highlight of the year. The awards evening culminated in the presentation of our most prestigious awards, with the Peter Auckland Sports Personality of the Year being awarded to Lily Gooderham (Year 10), the Jan Newnham Award for Contribution to School Sport awarded to Lewis Roberts (Year 11); the Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to Jessica Smith (Year 11). The full list of award winners is listed below. As a PE department, our thanks goes to all students for representing the school last year and we look forward to another successful year in 2023-2024.

Guest Speaker: Emily Heaslip

We were honoured to have Emily Heaslip join us as a guest speaker. Before going into refereeing on the international stage, Emily was playing football at semi-professional level and had been fortunate enough to represent England when she was selected for the European Championships at U19 level. In 2015, Emily decided to attend an all female Suffolk refereeing course before starting her career as a referee at Ipswich Town academy, alongside local men's football. At the time Emily refereed every so often, while continuing to play football. Emily was given the opportunity to go fully professional as a player, however decided to hang up her boots and pursue her refereeing career, and the rest is history! Emily now referees on the men's national league and women's super league, as well as operating internationally on the women's pathway. In 2023, Emily was selected to referee at the Vitality Women's FA cup final in May, where Chelsea beat Manchester United. The match saw 77,390 fans flock to the iconic Wembley stadium, which was a world record for a domestic women's match.

HARTISMERE SCHOOL TRIP TO SEE *THE LIFE OF PI* THEATRE ROYAL, NORWICH 28 SEPTEMBER 2023



On Thursday 28 September, students form year 7 and 8 and staff travelled to the Theatre Royal in Norwich to see *The Life of Pi*, the smash hit show newly transferred from London's West End. The stage spectacular, written by Playwright Lolita Chakrabarti, follows Piscine "Pi" Patel, the zookeeper's son from Pondicherry who claims to have survived a shipwreck in a life raft with a Bengal tiger in tow.



The stage was full of energy and surprise. "Once upon a time," says Pi, as he takes us on the first of many flashbacks, which transform the stage in seconds. There was a flurry of butterflies, a starry sky, iridescent shoals of fish and immersive storms that wrack the extremities of the stage. It was a fabulous production.





Zebras, giraffes, hyenas, and turtles were manipulated sublimely, transporting us to the family zoo and then to the high seas. The first sight of Richard Parker, the tiger, was a breath-taking moment and the back screen cracked open from its middle like a suitcase as the family sets sail for Canada. These animals and effects were a wonder to behold and became the real stars of this show.

BEGINNING AND END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

LAMDA PERFORMANCE EXAMINATION RESULTS 2023

Hartismere School is a private centre for the LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts) examinations. LAMDA believes in the transformative power of the dramatic arts and the value to society of creativity, innovation, and authentic, confident communication.

Our Acting exam learners develop their vocal, physical, and interpretive skills while they delve into characters and explore the background of dramatic texts. Alongside producing authentic performances of their chosen scenes, they also gain an understanding of the context and characters within them. Working through the grades takes our learners through the development of clear speaking and character portrayal to an understanding of a playwright's style, the influence of theatre practitioners such as Stanislavski and a sensitive appreciation of subtext.

This year 130 pupils from Hartismere School took part in performance exams over 4 days in June. They all worked very hard and deserve the fantastic results that they achieved.

(The editor adds: none of this would be possible without Mrs Davy's extraordinary work with the students. 130 students achieving LAMDA qualifications is quite something. Well done, and thank you Mrs Davy!)
