Hartismere School trip to see 'HAMILTON' Victoria Palace Theatre, London 11th January



On Thursday 11 January, we took 92 pupils to London to see the smash hit West-End show, Hamilton. Inspired by Ron Chernow's biography about one of America's founding fathers, Alexander Hamilton, the sung-and-rappedthrough biographical musical follows Hamilton from his early life as a poor orphan in the Caribbean, to his ascendency as the right-hand man of George Washington, to his death in an infamous duel with Aaron Burr.



We then made our way to the Victoria Palace Theatre to watch the matinee performance of Hamilton. Set during the late 1700s, this telling of Alexander Hamilton's life is inspiring and heartbreaking. Its beautifully explored themes of love, loss, forgiveness, and ambition make the story timeless and engaging. Love is a central theme in Hamilton. The musical is great for history buffs and fans of modern music alike. It is a one-of-a-kind experience that will stay with you long after the show is over.





As part of the day, pupils took part in a 2-hour theatre workshop at Danceworks in Balderton Street, followed by a walk taking in some of the famous London landmarks to Green Park where they had a picnic.

SEVERE WEATHER

If there has been severe weather overnight a decision will be made by 7:45am whether the school is to close. You can find out if the school is closed by:

Checking the school website - <u>www.hartismere.com</u> Receiving an SMS text alert (more info at <u>www.hartismere.com/sms</u>) Telephoning (01379) 870315. A message stating that the school is closed will be heard before any further options.

Please note we will only post messages if the school is closed or partially closed. We will not post any messages if the school is open.

Occasionally a bus may be delayed, and this can happen for a variety of reasons. Pupils will know the approximate time when their bus usually arrives at the pick-up point. Sometimes it may take up to 30mins for the bus company to be notified of the delay and, if appropriate, arrange for a replacement bus and driver. The normal instruction to pupils therefore is to wait at the pick-up point for this length of time. However if there is bad weather it is a matter of judgement of pupils and parents whether this time is too long. Clearly in very cold, snowy conditions children should not be waiting this length of time.

Parents should discuss this with their son or daughter and make arrangements so they know what to do if they have to return home when a bus fails to appear, particularly in severe conditions or if the school has to close early during the school day. It is important to make sure they have a house key or there is a relative or neighbour they can go to if parents are out at work.

In the unlikely event that the weather deteriorates **during the day** and would make the journey home from school hazardous, then school buses may be called early. We suggest that parents, particularly those who are likely to be at work, discuss the matter carefully with their son or daughter and have a plan in place so that pupils can return safely home, or to a near neighbour, until parents arrive home.

Visits to school & dropping things off...

If you are dropping something off for your child such as dinner money, forgotten PE kit, packed lunch or homework for example, please take it to Mrs Lawrence in the Pupil Services Office. This is located just inside the entrance to the Sports Hall. Please remind your child that they should go there to collect it. If they do not know that you are bringing something in we will attempt to get a message to them.

If you are coming into the school for any other reason such as a meeting with a member of staff, please remember to report to Reception and sign in.

HARTISMERE THEATRE WORKHOP 2023: TREASURE ISLAND PANTO

Each year, year 10 GCSE drama pupils take part in a Theatre-in-education style project called the Hartismere Theatre Workshops. The project's aim is to introduce year 10 GCSE drama pupils, some of whom have never performed to an audience before, to the workings of a professional Theatre-in-Education Company, under the management of the pupils themselves. This year the cast performed to over 380 Hartismere pupils from year 7 and 8 and to over 300 pupils from our primary feeder-schools, as well as 2 evening performances to friends and families, all in 8 days.

The cast also put together most of the costumes and props and were in control of the drama workshops for the primary school audiences . Pupils were also responsible for the lighting and sound design; photography students were busily snapping pictures of the cast during rehearsals and performances and Mrs Smith and her food tech pupils kindly provided refreshments including delicious treasure cupcakes.

This year, audiences enjoyed the magic of Mrs Ladd's fisherman pies being pushed into Bodmin's face, the Squire and his cronies being pelted by coconuts, characters walking the plank, dancing the Macarena, a giant crimson parrot called Captain Haddock and a whole-audience conga! (You had to be there!) We were also delighted to receive some fantastic theatre reviews from the primary schools.
